Richie Swanson came of age living outside in nature, bicycling and backpacking throughout North America. He lives simply on the upper Mississippi river, hauling water and heating with wood.

Sunstone Press will publish *First Territory*, his novel set during the Walla Walla Treaty Council and Yakama War, Washington and Oregon Territories, 1855-1856. The release date will be announced soon.

Richie won the Year 2000 National Peace Writing Award for an unpublished novel that contributes to peacemaking, granted by Peace Hope. *Removal*, his collection of short stories, was a finalist in the 2012 Spokane Prize for Short Fiction. He has worked as an environmental consultant and for Mississippi River Revival in Winona, conducting interpretive events and advocating for threatened species, habitat protection and a cleaner river.
