## Chipping Sparrow

DESCRIPTION OF PLOT: A rectangular plot, 12.6 ha. (350 m. x 400 m.), of uplands hardwoods forest in a state park on a steep bluff adjacent to the Mississippi River, approx. 1,000 m. north of the bank of the river. Predominant tree species are red oak, white oak, bitternut hickory, shagbark hickory, basswood, black walnut. Predominant canopy species is red oak. Canopy is approx. 75% closed with an approx. range of 10-35 m. Understory includes basswood, bitternut hickory, ironwood. Ground cover includes slender nettles, bedstraw, interrupted fern, lady ferns, northern maidenhair, bulblet fern, wood anemone, jack-in-the-pulpit, may apple and many other plants. Similar habitat surrounds the plot. The west border of the plot is 150 m. from the bottom of a ravine and rises at a 22% slope to the east border at a ridge line. The ridge is wooded with American white birch, burr oak, smooth sumac, red cedar, northern white cedar, bigtooth aspen. Elevation: 225 m. to 305 m.

PRECIPITATION: June 14.9 cm; July 5.8 cm  
NORMAL PRECIP: June 9.3 cm; July 10.1 cm

Temperatures and precipitation came from U.S. Weather Station, LaCrosse, Wisconsin.
